As discussed in the invitation letter to you, NHEC will ask you to volunteer from 1 to 3 days to the Institute, and will match your background to the curriculum. Based on discussions with you, as well as your resume, availability, and the curriculum, NHEC will schedule your participation in the Institute. Role models must agree to spend the entire day with students, every day they are at the Institute. If it becomes evident that there are too many volunteers for a particular topic, NHEC may not be able to schedule you to participate in the Institute.

NHEC has funding to subsidize the costs of some volunteer role models, but many role models have obtained support from their employer to cover their costs to the Institute. If you can do the same, it would help NHEC and the students. Once you send us your application, NHEC will evaluate, match you with the curriculum, and then contact you to begin discussions. NHEC reserves the right to make revisions to the curriculum and schedule of activities, if necessary.
